University Officers' Biographical Notes



Chancellor

Mrs Caroline Bennett BSc *Otago* BEd DipEd MEd BEdAdmin *Massey*

Newly-appointed in 1998 as the Chancellor of Waikato University, Mrs Caroline Bennett has had a long association with education. After gaining her BSc at Otago University, she went on to earn her Diploma of Education, Bachelor of Education and Master of Education Administration at Massey University. Mrs Bennett has taught for just under a decade at Fairfield College, serving as Deputy Principal from 1989 to 1995, and Principal from 1995 to the present day. Her official association with Waikato University began in 1991 when she served as a member of the University Council, representing the Court of Convocation, and the Board of Trustees and Secondary Schools in the catchment area of Waikato University. Mrs Bennett was appointed Pro-Chancellor in 1992, a position she held for six years before becoming Chancellor in 1998. As well as her educational achievements, Mrs Bennett was the Dame Jean Herbesian Fellow in 1992, and the Honorary Fellow of the New Zealand Educational Administration Society in 1996.



Pro-Chancellor

Mr John Gallagher, JP

As a business leader John Gallagher brings a wealth of business and community experience to the University Council. Currently he is Deputy Mayor and a shareholder and Director of one of New Zealand's most successful export companies, the Gallagher Group. As an ardent supporter of growth and development in the community, John is actively involved with numerous community organisations including Habitat for Humanity, Rotary and St John's Ambulance. He became the Deputy Mayor of Hamilton City in mid-1997 after twelve years as a city councillor. As a local body politician he has been instrumental in promoting and driving many of the City facilities and services. John was first elected to the University Council in 1990 as the representative from the Employers' Association and is currently a member of the Finance Committee and a Trustee of the University of Waikato Foundation.



Vice-Chancellor

Professor Bryan Gould BA LLM *Auck* MA BCL *Oxf*

It has been a long and winding road for the Hawera-born Bryan Charles Gould, one that has led him from Auckland and Victoria Universities, through to Oxford University on a Rhodes Scholarship, then to the British Labour Party, Member of Parliament, director of the Labour general election campaign in 1987, and ultimately back to New Zealand, where he currently holds the position of Vice-Chancellor at Waikato University. After attending primary and secondary school in Palmerston North and Dannevirke, Professor Gould went on to take a double BA/LLB at Auckland and Victoria Universities, majoring in history for his Bachelor of Arts. In 1962 he took up a Rhodes Scholarship to Balliol College, Oxford, taking out his BCL(Oxon) with First Class Honours in 1964, and finally his MA in 1968. During this time he worked for the British Foreign Office, including some time as second secretary at the British Embassy in Brussels. Following a period as a Tutor and Fellow in Law at Worcester College, Oxford, Professor Gould entered politics in 1974, working for three years as the Parliamentary Private Secretary to the Rt. Hon. Peter Shore MP. A stint as a reporter and presenter on a Thames Television nationally networked current affairs show followed from 1979 to 1983, before entering politics again. This involved some ten years in the British Labour Party in various roles, including Shadow Trade and Industry Secretary, Shadow Environment Secretary and the Labour Party election campaign director for both the Euro-Elections in 1989 and General Elections in 1987 and 1992. Professor Gould has been the author of numerous publications, including *Socialism and Freedom, A Future for Socialism*, and the autobiographical *Goodbye to All That* in 1995. As a former university representative in various sports, Professor Gould retains an interest in tennis and swimming, as well as cooking, wine, gardening, music and New Zealand history.



Deputy Vice-Chancellor

Professor M J Selby MA DipEd DSc *Oxf* DPhil *Waikato*

Professor Selby joined the staff of the newly-established University of Waikato in 1964. He was appointed to the Department of Earth Sciences in 1970, when the School of Science was established, and to a personal chair in Earth Sciences in 1980. Professor Selby's main academic interests have been in engineering geology, soil erosion control and the application of rock mechanics to the studies of the stability of hillslopes; these interests have led him to undertake field work in the hot deserts of Africa - the Sahara and Namib - the cold desert of Antarctica, and in the high mountains of the Himalaya and Andes. His research has been summarised in his book *Hillslope Materials and Processes* (Oxford University Press).

Since 1986 Professor Selby has been Deputy Vice-Chancellor with particular responsibility for research policy and commercialisation of applied research.



Assistant Vice-Chancellor

Mr J J Callaghan BA *York (UK)* MA *R'dg*

Jeremy Callaghan is Assistant Vice-Chancellor at the University of Waikato. He was appointed Registrar in 1988, assuming his new role in 1994. Previous positions include appointments as Assistant Registrar at the University of Salford, UK; Graduate Assistant at the University of Sydney, Australia; Senior Assistant Registrar at the Papua New Guinea University of Technology and Senior Assistant Academic Secretary at the City Polytechnic of Hong Kong. He holds the degrees of Bachelor of Arts from the University of York and Master of Arts from the University of Reading.

He has recently returned from a period of special leave spent as an Honorary Visiting Fellow at the University of York in the United Kingdom where, amongst other things, he completed the draft of a short book on committee servicing.

Jeremy is married with two young children and lists his interests as squash, acting and vintage cars.



Dean of Computing and Mathematical Sciences

Professor Ian Graham BSc *Lond* PhD *Camb*

Professor Ian Graham took up his position of Dean of Computing and Mathematical Science in 1990, the same year as the School moved into the new, purpose-built premises in G Block. Prior to his appointment as Dean, Professor Graham held the position of Chair of the Computer Sciences Programme, a post he gained within a few months of arriving at the University of Waikato in 1986. After gaining his first degree at St Mary's College, London, Professor Graham went on to take his second degree at Cambridge University, majoring in astronomy, where he was part of the Radio Astronomy group. Following a period of three years in Germany, where he studied Archaeological Science, Professor Graham returned to London where he taught at the Institute of Archaeology, teaching quantitative methods to archaeologists. Professor Graham is currently involved in a project which involves measuring the performance of communications networks, the findings of which will benefit Internet and other communication consumers in New Zealand and around the world.



Principal and Dean of Education

Professor Noeline Alcorn BA *Well* MA *Cant* PhD Calif DipEd *Massey* DipT

Professor Noeline Alcorn taught in New Zealand secondary schools for some years before undertaking her doctoral study at the University of California. She held lecturing and management positions at Auckland Teachers' College and was the Director of the Centre for Continuing Education at the University of Auckland before taking up her current position as Principal and Dean at the School of Education. Professor Alcorn was Chairperson of the New Zealand Council for Educational Research from 1988 until 1993, and was awarded the Suffrage Medal in 1993. She is a Fellow of the New Zealand Educational Administration Society. Professor Alcorn has published widely in children's literature, school principalship and action research, and is currently researching educational administration, professional development and higher education policy. She recently completed a biography of C.E. Beeby.



Dean of Humanities

Professor Peter Oettli BA NZ MA PhD *Auck*

Born in Switzerland, Professor Peter Oettli emigrated to New Zealand in his teens, attending Hamilton Boys' High School to learn English. Professor Oettli went on to Auckland University (known then as the Auckland University College of the University of New Zealand) to study for his BA degree. He attained both his MA and PhD at what had become, in the meantime, the University of Auckland, specialising in German mediaeval literature. In 1965/66, Professor Oettli spent a year in Germany as a Humboldt Fellow, researching his field of interest, before joining Waikato University in 1966. He was made Dean of Humanities in 1992. As well as teaching selected mediaeval German papers, Professor Oettli is currently involved in writing a book about Johann Friedrich Riemenschneider (1817-1866), a German missionary who came to New Zealand in 1843 and was active in Taranaki and Otago.



Dean of Law

Professor Margaret Bedggood QSO MA NZ and *Lond* LLB *Otago*

Professor Bedggood took up the position of Dean of the School of Law at Waikato University in August of 1994. She gained her Master of Arts in New Zealand and London, and her LLB at Otago University. Prior to taking up her appointment as Dean, Professor Bedggood was the Chief Human Rights Commissioner for five years. Professor Bedggood's research interests include employment law and all aspects of human rights law, both at a national and international level.



Dean of Management

Professor Michael Pratt BA *Sheff* MCom *Witw* DCom SA ACA FCA

A specialist in the areas of management accounting, auditing and leadership, Professor Michael Pratt joined Waikato University in 1990 as Dean of the School of Management and Professor of Accounting and Finance. With extensive industry experience - having worked as an auditor for an international accounting practice in London, an accountant in the motor industry, and as a management consultant - Professor Pratt is also currently involved with investigating the practices of peak performing organisations and the underlying factors behind the corporate failures following the 1987 Stock Exchange crash. Professor Pratt has taught on several different MBA programmes internationally and has delivered more than one hundred management development seminars on a wide range of subjects. He gained his doctorate in Financial Planning Models from the University of South Africa.



Dean of Māori and Pacific Development

Professor Tamati Reedy MA *Auck* MA PhD *Hawaii*

Professor Reedy is the foundation Dean and Professor of the new School of Māori and Pacific Development at the University of Waikato, created in 1996. Professor Reedy gained his MA (Hons) in English at Auckland University, and an MA and Doctorate of Philosophy in Linguistics at the University of Hawaii. He was also a Fulbright Scholar at the University of Alabama. Prior to his appointment as Dean in 1996, Professor Reedy was the Chief Executive and Secretary for the Māori Affairs Department, New Zealand. With his wife Tilly, he has managed his own consultancy business in education and training in the public and private sector.



Dean of Sciences and Technology

Professor Richard Price BSc (Hons) *ANU* PhD *Otago*

Professor Richard Price joined the University of Waikato in 1998 as the new Dean of the School of Science and Technology, taking over from Professor Ken Mackay. Formerly an Associate Professor in Geology at La Trobe University, Professor Price gained his bachelors degree in science from Australian National University, and was awarded his doctorate from Otago University in 1974. His major research interests include the application of trace element, major element and isotope geochemistry to geological problems throughout Australia, New Zealand and the Pacific. With a distinguished academic and publishing record to his credit, Professor Price is currently involved in a co-operative research project with academic colleagues from Auckland, Victoria and Massey Universities, studying the geology of Mounts Ruapehu and Taranaki.



Dean of Social Science

Professor Peggy G Koopman-Boyden CNZM MA DipEd *Massey*

Professor Peggy Koopman-Boyden has undertaken sociological, demographic and policy research on ageing, and has chaired or has been a member of many national committees on social policy, family, women and the elderly. These include the New Zealand Planning Council, National Council on HIV/AIDs, and the Gerontology Association. She is a Life Member of Age Concern (Canterbury) and was awarded a CNZM (Companion of the NZ Order of Merit) for services to the elderly.

Peter Richard King BSc MSc *Waikato*

Thesis Title: "The Geology of Taranaki Basin: depositional systems, tectonic setting, and petroleum habitats"

Mr Peter King graduated BSc (1974) and MSc(Hons) (1978) in Earth Sciences from The University of Waikato. Following an early career as a production geologist in oil companies in the Middle East, in 1984 Mr King joined what is now the Institute of Geological and Nuclear Sciences Ltd (formerly New Zealand Geological Survey) as a petroleum geologist. His research since then has centred particularly on the understanding of the subsurface geology and petroleum systems of Taranaki Basin off the western North Island, which currently contains New Zealand's only commercially-producing hydrocarbon fields. Mr King has been influential in integrating petroleum industry data with added value Government-funded research, and in promoting a wider understanding of Taranaki Basin geology through several substantial publications and many international conference presentations. Amongst articles submitted for the DSc degree on the theme "The Geology of the Taranaki Basin" are two impressive and important monographs, one a benchmark reference volume on the Basin's stratigraphy, paleogeography, structural evolution, tectonic setting, and hydrocarbon habitats; the other describing Miocene-age deep-water successions exposed along the Basin's western margin in North Taranaki. Mr King has produced a substantial body of work on basin analysis that demonstrates both high originality and exceptional quality.

Doctors of Philosophy

Abu Shiraz Abdul Rahaman BSc (Hons) *Ghana* MMS, DPhil *Waikato*

Thesis Title: "Public sector accounting and financial management in the context of a developing country: An empirical study of the Volta River Authority in Ghana"

Using the Volta River Authority, a major public corporation responsible for generation and distribution of electricity in Ghana and neighbouring countries, the thesis sought to investigate the nature and effectiveness of accounting and financial control systems in a developing country. In particular, the thesis was motivated by the growing concern about widespread deficiency of public sector accounting and financial control systems and practices in contemporary developing countries. Grounded in an interpretive methodological orientation and appreciating the existence of multiple realities in the functioning of accounting, the thesis critiqued the dominant perspective and explored the basic deficiency claim in a three-dimensional fashion (i.e. from a technical rational perspective, socio-historical perspective and socio-economic development perspective).

Alan Kai Ming Au MBA *Massey* MMS *Waikato*

Thesis Title: "The Development of an International Model for Technology Adoption: The Case of Hong Kong"

This thesis develops a model of international technology adoption based on the theory of planned behaviour. The behavioural model investigates the constructs influencing technology adoption decisions and how the interaction between these constructs and external variables impact on the decision-making process at the level of the firm.

The model is tested by data provided by 259 respondents to a survey of Hong Kong manufacturing firms. Statistical testing revealed that the intention to adopt was strongly influenced by the attitude of the prospective adopter, industry rivalry and government technology policy. The results are of immediate value to Hong Kong policy makers concerned to upgrade manufacturing activity in Hong Kong.

Alan Au is a graduate of Hong Kong Baptist College. He holds an MBA from Massey University and an MMS

from the University of Waikato. He is currently a lecturer at the Open University of Hong Kong.

Hugh Randal Barr DipT, BA, MA *Waikato*

Thesis Title: "Designing a Teacher Development Programme to Enhance the Teaching of Higher Order Thinking and Conceptual Understanding in Primary School Social Studies"

Today's Schools organise their own programmes of teacher development. This study suggests the best programmes are also those which provide models of curriculum theory which can be easily related to classroom practice.

Margaret Ann Carr BA, MA *Wellington* DipEd Studies, Dip NZFKU *Waikato*

Thesis Title: "Technological Practice in Early Childhood as a Dispositional Milieu"

This study investigated the learning of a group of four-year-olds as they worked in the construction area of a sessional early childhood setting. The researcher participated and observed as the children constructed with cardboard, added collage and paint to pictures and constructions, and screen-printed cut-out figures and shapes of various kinds. The learning in each of these activities can be defined, identified, and investigated. The key dispositional domains were identified as privileged discourses, preferred responses to difficulty, and favoured patterns of responsibility. Four learning dispositions were identified from these domains: courage, mindfulness, perseverance and responsibility. These learning dispositions find a parallel in the strands of the early childhood curriculum for Aotearoa New Zealand, Te Whariki.

Craig Verdun Deprce BSc, MSc *Waikato*

Thesis Title: "Active Food Packaging: Aspects of Oxygen-Scavenging Films"

Craig's thesis research was carried out under the Graduate Research in Industry Fellowship scheme, jointly with the Chemistry Department and Trigon Packaging Systems, Te Rapa. His thesis involved developing polymer films that absorbed oxygen without releasing volatile products, so that produce sealed within the film would be protected from oxidation. This would give markedly longer shelf-life for many items.

A new class of compound for this purpose was successfully identified and characterised it to the stage where it can now be taken up for further development.

Craig is currently pursuing post-doctoral research at Massey University.

Maarten Bernard Dinger BSc, MSc *Waikato*

Thesis Title: "Aspects of Metallacyclic Chemistry"

Maarten Dinger's DPhil research concerned the chemistry of the platinum group metals with nitrogen-based metallacyclic ligands derived from ureas, thioureas and guanidines. Such metallacycles occur as intermediates in metal-catalysed reactions of organic molecules, yet surprisingly little is known about their structures and reactivities. The first examples of a range of such compounds were prepared for the metals platinum, rhodium, iridium, ruthenium and osmium. Studies were also carried out with related gold complexes, and a major thrust of this part of the work was to develop compounds with good anticancer activity.

William Richard Doolin BMS, MSc, DPhil *Waikato*

Thesis title: "Discourse, Technology and Organisation in a New Zealand Crown Health Enterprise"

The thesis examined how various management and information technologies were implicated in the organisational changes that occurred in a Crown Health Enterprise in response to recent health care reforms in New Zealand. The study demonstrated the usefulness of the concept of discursive ordering strategies for making sense of the ordering processes that constitute organisation, and highlighted the importance of

information technology in constructing and stabilising sociotechnical networks within inherently complex organisations such as hospitals.

Alistair Michael Forret BSc (Hons) Robert Gordon Institute of Technology

Thesis Title: "Learning Electronics: An Accessible Introduction"

This study was an investigation into the early learning of electronics. It proposed a view of learning as a complex, dynamic and developmental process, whereby ideas are generated, then tested for, and selected on, value. This view, seen as consistent with the nature of human technology, was employed in the design of a teaching package for the practical introduction of component electronics. The classroom trials of the electronics teaching package were carried out with 14-year-old students. The research findings showed students' increased interest in electronics, enhanced practical competence in constructing circuits and promotion of problem-solving skills. This study showed that the teaching package based on this view of learning provided many students with interesting and enjoyable access to electronics.

Jennifer Gwen Jago BSc, MSc (Tech) *Waikato*

Thesis Title: "The Effects of Active Immunisation against Gonadotrophin-Releasing Hormone on Behaviour, Reproductive Physiology, Growth and Meat Quality in Male Cattle"

This thesis described the effectiveness of a non-surgical technique for reducing testosterone production in bulls, through active immunisation against gonadotrophin releasing hormone (GnRH) - commonly known as immunocastration.

Elizabeth La Franchie BHortSc (Hons) *Massey, DPhil Waikato*

Thesis Title: "Seasonal Growth of Nashi"

A continuing interest in horticulture prompted Liz La Franchie to study the Japanese pear, nashi. This fruit has been a significant crop in Asia for centuries but has only recently been introduced to New Zealand. Liz's research compared the three main cultivars commercially grown in New Zealand (Hosui, Kosui and Nijisseiki) in terms of their growth rate and fruit production. Factors affecting crop load such as leaf number, leaf photosynthetic rate, and position of fruit on the tree were analysed in detail. This research has added significantly to existing knowledge about production of nashi in New Zealand.

Jacqueline May Lidgard MSocSc *Waikato*

Thesis Title: "Northeast Asian Migration: Recent Change in New Zealand's International Migration System"

Jacqueline Lidgard's thesis is the first substantive analysis of the dramatic changes in migration between countries on the Asia-Pacific Rim and New Zealand since the major changes in immigration policy made by the Labour Government in 1986. These policy changes removed from New Zealand's immigration policy the discrimination in favour of migrants from "traditional" sources, especially Great Britain and selected countries in Europe. The contribution which migration from four countries in Northeast Asia - the People's Republic of China, Hong Kong, Taiwan and Korea - has made to New Zealand's population growth, age composition and labour force are examined in the wider context of on-going initiatives in immigration policy and the debate about the kinds of support migrants from different cultural backgrounds need to assist them to become effectively involved in New Zealand's bi-cultural society. The findings of this thesis have considerable relevance for those concerned about immigration policy in the late 1990s, especially as the New Zealand Government has recently announced that it wishes to attract over 35,000 new immigrants, many of them from countries in Northeast Asia, over the twelve months July 1998-June 1999.

Lois Ellen Luke BA, MA, DPhil *Waikato*

Thesis Title: "The Rich Man in his Castle. The Other Nation, The Poor in Nineteenth-Century Literature"

Lois Luke has a BA and MA Hons from the University of Waikato. Her doctoral thesis examines works of fiction, mainly those written for children, which show the plight of the poor child in nineteenth-century Britain. These are set against the social history of the period, especially the efforts to improve the lot of the poor by such reformers as Shaftesbury, Barnardo and William Booth. Many of these fictions alerted readers to the plight of children working in industry or abandoned on city streets, and espoused action on behalf those too young to speak for themselves.

Tina Maria McAdie BSocSc, MSocSc, DPhil *Waikato*

Thesis Title: "The Effects of White Noise on the Operant Behaviour of Domestic Hens"

Tina McAdie investigated methods of asking animals whether or not some aspect of their environment was aversive. She studied this with domestic hens using white noise as the potentially aversive stimulus and investigated the effects of various ways of associating the presence of noise with the behaviour of the hens. She showed that, as with positive stimuli such as food, the context in which the sound was delivered had as important an effect as the type of sound itself on the way the sound influenced behaviour. She found that a concurrent schedule procedure was an appropriate method to use, giving reliable measures of the effects of the noise. However, unlike other sounds explored previously, the presence of white noise tended to reduce hen behaviour. The results suggested that white noise at the intensity used was aversive in many situations. They also suggested that a preference for a sound to be turned off might not always mean that sound has aversive properties. Thus care needs to be taken in interpreting preference measures. Her research provides a sound framework for investigations of the aversiveness or otherwise of a range of other aspects of the environment.

Jason Scott McIndoe BSc, MSc, DPhil *Waikato*

Thesis Title: "New Development in Metal Carbonyl Chemistry"

Scott's thesis deals with the chemistry of compounds which contain silicon linked to transition metals like iron and cobalt. These are of fundamental interest, as well as being intermediate species in a number of catalytic processes. Among other successes, Scott identified a rearrangement reaction which occurs under very mild conditions, in contrast to previous examples where irradiation was needed.

During the research Scott established methods which allowed his samples to be analysed by the new technique of electrospray mass spectrometry. This development is attracting international attention, as it provides an extra analytical tool for inorganic chemists.

Scott has now moved to the University of Cambridge, UK, to further his research.

Geoffrey Newton Mills BSc, MSc (Hons) *Waikato*

Thesis Title: "Extractable Organics and Colour in a Bleached Kraft Mill Effluent Application System and Recipient Ground Waters"

After completing an MSc(Hons) in chemistry at the University of Waikato and spending some time with the Department of Scientific and Industrial Research, Geoffrey was appointed as a junior lecturer in chemistry and registered for a DPhil. The research work underlying the thesis was a study of the Kinleith land application system, augmented by laboratory soil column tests to provide insight into the fate of pulp and paper effluents under different modes of soil percolation. He has provided a wealth of information on pulp mill contamination analysis and proposed contaminant transformation pathways on lagoon and land application treatment systems. Information of this type is in short supply and Geoffrey's contribution to the field has been substantial.

Judith Margaret Motion BA, MMS *Waikato*

Thesis Title: "Technologies of the Self: A Public Identity Framework"

The aim of the thesis was to examine the historical, organisational, media and public relations discourses that shape public identity. Oral history interviews were undertaken with women Members of Parliament and women Mayors between 1994 and 1996. Public relations consultants who worked with women politicians were also interviewed in order to examine their role in creating public identity. Post-structural theory was drawn upon in order to analyse the interviews and to create a new public relations theory of public identity work. Six technologies of the self were identified that construct public identity: historical narration, positioning, commodification, mediatization, aesthetics and morality. The major contributions to the study and practice of public relations were the introduction of post-structuralist thought, moral theory and media theory to the neglected field of public relations for individuals. The thesis was supervised by Associate Professor Shirley Leitch, Associate Professor Keith Hooper and Dr Anna Green.

Scott Donald Osborne BSc, MSc *Waikato*

Thesis Title: "Non-Destructive of Internal Fruit Quality"

In his thesis Scott investigated whether low-cost spectrometers can be used to determine fruit quality non-destructively. The work required the development of suitable hardware to illuminate the fruit and to record the spectra of light transmitted through the fruit, as well as the development of software to interpret these spectra. The main focus was placed on the measurement of dry matter and soluble solid, or sugar content of kiwifruit. The research showed that the equipment and software could be used to predict these parameters with high accuracy and that the fruit could be separated into distinct taste categories. The technology is currently being implemented in commercial fruit grading equipment.

Peter Leslie Singleton BSc, MSc *Waikato*

Thesis Title: "Nitrogen Leaching and Denitrification Losses from Effluent-Irrigated Soil with Controlled Drainage"

Peter Singleton conducted the research for this thesis while working full-time, initially for Landcare Research and later for AgResearch. The research investigated a novel technique of controlling farm drainage systems to minimise the possibility of groundwater pollution when agricultural wastes are applied to land. The study elucidated the fate of agricultural wastes in soils and demonstrated the technique may be useful for some farms in the Waikato.

William John Teahan BSc *Victoria*, MSc *Massey*

Thesis Title: "Modelling English Text"

Leonard Eric Trigg BCMS (Hons) *Waikato*

Thesis Title: "Designing Similarity Functions"

Len enrolled in his PhD after completing a BCMS Honours degree in Computer Science at the University of Waikato. His main research area is machine learning, a branch of computer science that attempts to build systems that can change their behaviour in a way that makes them perform better in the future. He worked on a fundamental problem of the area which is concerned with determining the degree of similarity between two objects. The traditional method for determining similarity is to combine a Euclidean distance measure over numeric features with some measure for symbolic features. This approach does not extend well to features of different types, or permit the encoding of domain knowledge in the similarity measure. Len took the approach that similarity should be measured in terms of the simplicity of transforming one object into the other, using ideas from the field of algorithmic complexity as a basis. The result was a new machine learning program called

K* which is easily customised to new domains and thus outperforms other machine learning programs of the same genre in these domains. Len is now a post-doctoral fellow in machine learning at the University of Waikato.

Adrian Scott Walcroft BSc, MSc *Waikato*

Thesis Title: "Photosynthesis and Transpiration in a Dry-Land Pinus Radiata Forest"

Pinus radiata is becoming a dominant part of the physical, biotic and economic landscape of New Zealand and considerable effort is expended in understanding the basic and applied biology of the species. Adrian's research was conducted jointly with Landcare Research and was designed to investigate the performance of *radiata* in dry-land conditions. Adrian produced a leaf-level model of photosynthesis and water balance which explains many attributes of wood production. This model was able to explain the elusive relationship between stable isotope composition of growth rings in wood and seasonal growth. Similarly the work was able to explain physiological responses of plants to shading. The models produced from this work will allow better prediction of the responses of trees to even subtle changes in environments, as well as the gross ones. The work was supported by a Scholarship from AGMARDIT (The Agricultural Marketing and Research Development Trust).

Master of Philosophy Biographical Notes

Bao Quan Li BA Jiangxi Normal University

Thesis Title: "Confronting the Challenges in Marketing Inbound Tourism for Group Tours in Jiangxi Province"

The thesis discusses the challenges to developing effective strategies of marketing inbound group tours to an inland province of Jiangxi in The People's Republic of China. In the study, Hong Kong is selected as a target generating market for Jiangxi. The research explores the primary influencing factors that affect Hong Kong outbound group tours to Jiangxi. The findings of the research indicate the primary factors to be the quality and price of the tourist product and the availability of air transportation. The effective strategies for marketing inbound group tours to Jiangxi are presented as well.

Masayoshi Ogino BA Dokkyo University MPhil *Waikato*

Thesis Title: "The Use of Japanese Teaching Assistants in New Zealand"

The rise in popularity of Japanese language study in New Zealand secondary schools has been occasioned by a problem in which the demand for appropriately qualified foreign language teachers has outstripped their supply. One potential solution which has been gaining currency is the use of native speakers of Japanese as teaching assistants in New Zealand language classes. This study looks at the use of Japanese Teaching Assistants (JTAs) in New Zealand, discussing their background qualifications and experience, their expectations of the team teaching situation, their evaluation of the current practice, and the nature of their interaction with the hosting institutions, the Master Teachers (MTs) with whom they are assigned to work, and the students. The MTs' perspective is also surveyed, as is that of students. The nature of the interaction in the classroom is also analysed and the study concludes with some important recommendations which are needed to realise the full potential of this valuable aid to language education in New Zealand.
