PROJECT TITLE: Desirable attributes of future medical school graduates

FIELD: Māori and Pacific health

PROJECT ABSTRACT:

In an anticipation of a third medical school being established here at the University of Waikato, this summer research project will build on a previous study conducted by two Masters' students from Te Huataki Waiora Te Huataki Waiora School of Health (Galewski, 2022; Maikuku, 2022) - and a 2023 summer research project [HREC(Health)2023#53]. Respectively, these projects involved asking Māori and Pacific peoples living in Te Roohe Pootae and Ngāruawāhia about their healthcare experiences, needs, and aspirations, and the analyses of the qualitative and survey data identified three sets of desirable attributes for medical graduates. The intention is that the combined findings of these studies will inform the Graduate Medical School curriculum. For this summer project, we are looking for a student who LIVES IN, COMES FROM, or has CLOSE CONNECTION TO a (different) rural or remote community in the Waikato region, to conduct a similar but shorter study.
